Overview

The Exchange Program ASU-CIDE is designed for undergraduate students interested in learning about Mexico's Economic and Political environment, language and culture. CIDE is a center for research and higher education that specializes in social sciences in accordance with international quality standards. Students will engage with CIDE's students and faculty to explore contemporaneous and historical aspects of the country and their role in the Global Economy.

Mexico City, the capital of Mexico is one of the biggest cities in the world, and the most important political, educational and financial center in the country. CIDE is located in Santa Fe, a modern and vibrant neighborhood in Mexico City.

Academics

CIDE provides access to: full-time staff of research professors who have PhDs from the most prestigious universities worldwide, an academic tutor per student, research programs, small group interactions between students and faculty, one of the best libraries in Latin America for social studies, and language courses at no additional cost.

Classes meet three hours a week and are worth 3 ASU credits. CIDE undergraduate exchange students are expected to take four or five courses per semester (students may sign up for up to six and narrow their choices to four or five after the first week of classes). Courses are in Spanish or English. Applicants should discuss this program with their academic advisors to meet degree requirements.

ASU-CIDE Scholarship

\$1,000 (one student per semester). **Scholarship criteria:** enrolled full-time at ASU, 3.0 cumulative GPA, have a current FAFSA on file with ASU Financial Aid and Scholarship Services at the time of application. Preference will be given to first-generation students, but all who qualify are encouraged to apply. To be considered for this scholarship, please start a fall 2017 study abroad application for the CIDE exchange program and submit a brief personal statement (details online) by February 15, 2017.

Costs*

Exchange program participants will pay ASU tuition and fees for the term of the Exchange program, according to the individual student's classification and degree level. In addition to ASU tuition and fees, participants are also responsible for paying the following non-refundable fees: \$50 Application Fee, \$400 Administrative Fee and Health Insurance. CIDE does not provide on-campus accommodation or transportation, but does offer assistance in securing housing. Exchange students are assisted by the staff of the Office of International Academic Affairs who provide access to the Accommodation Network.
